A LITTLE PTA HISTORY.....

The very first parent's group on record in Florida was the East Jacksonville Mother's Club. One year after the National PTA Congress selected the Oak tree as its emblem in 1921, Florida became the 38th state to organize a "branch" in the national PTA. The prime PTA project back in the early 20's was improving lunchrooms.

The types of projects the PTA has been involved with over the years have changed considerably. In 1992, the Florida Department of Education requested that PTA members become the trainers for the new School Advisory Councils for the Accountability System in the Florida public schools. Parents, teachers and students now work together to improve every aspect of school organization and functioning.

Even though the methods of the PTA have changed considerably over the years, the general purpose has not. Parents and teachers really strive for one common goal. That goal is to provide an appropriate educational program in an environment that enables students to succeed. It is the dream of all parents and guardians that their children grow up happy and healthy, are given the tools to become independent, are given the opportunity to reach their full potential, and are allowed to live, work, and prosper in their own communities.
