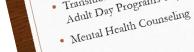

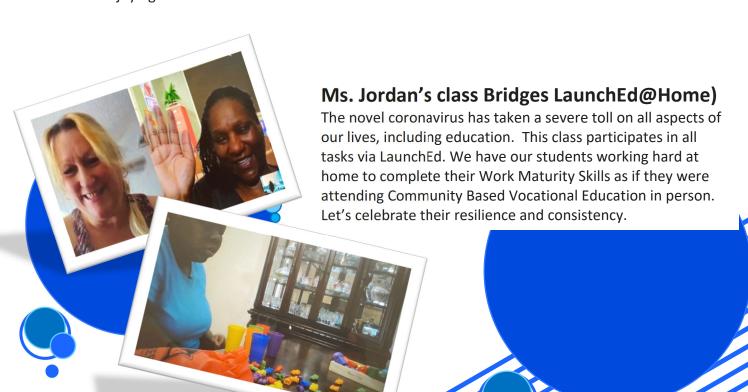


Classroom Success Stories

Ms. Wilken's class (Bridges F2F)

My class focuses on the student's first, which gives each of them the opportunity to become productive citizens in our community. In the mornings students are given their timesheet which they use to track their work hours just like in the real world. The students are responsible for clocking in and out for two consecutive weeks and at the end they must tally up their hours and calculate their wages based on an hourly rate of \$10. Once their wages are determined they see the banker and cash their checks. Upon receiving their wages, the money is used for several items, just as we do as productive citizens in the community. During the month students are responsible for paying rent, utilities, cable, and cell phone bill. They may also purchase items from the on-campus store as well. If for some reason their expenses are more than their wages, they must come up with alternatives. Their options are borrowing from the bank, and paying the loan back with interest, borrow from a friend with pay back deadline and or do without. My students are learning life skills and enjoying it!





Classroom Success Stories



Mr. Peter Taylor's class (High School F2F)

The students in my room have had immense success demonstrated by a 5 percent growth in grades across all subject areas. The classroom staff members work well together to address the academic and behavioral needs of the students. Students have improved their ability to follow their daily routine and work well with staff members. I was most impressed by the growth in science when students were learning about macronutrients. Students learned the value of eating a variety of foods. Students were able to sort food items into the correct

macronutrient categories (carbs, protein, fats) and match the foods to the benefit to the body. This type of learning is very impressive especially as students deal with all the changes brought on by COVID-19.

Ms. Gordon's Art Club

This year the Art Club has had opportunities to participate in a variety of contests and Art Exhibits. Most recently we completed mini-canvas for the Tiny Art Show currently on display at RBELC. Our students will also participate in The Winter Park Sidewalk Art Festival's Virtual Leon Theodore Schools Exhibit, which goes live on Monday, March 15 at 6pm.
